Mexico leads efforts against illicit trafficking in firearms

The Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized



Crime adopted on October 21st a draft resolution submitted by Mexico, along with Costa Rica and Guatemala, about "Strengthening the implementation of the Protocol against the Manufacturing Illicit and Trafficking in Firearms, their Parts Components and and Ammunition". The final version of the text was co-patronaged by Argentina, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, El Salvador, Norway, Peru and Member States of the European Union.

The initiative highlights the links between the implementation of the Firearms Protocol of the Palermo Convention and the fulfillment of the objectives of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, in particular, its Goal 16.4, which seeks to significantly reduce the flow of illicit weapons. The project also recognizes the complementarity between the Protocol and other international frameworks, such as the Arms Trade Treaty (ATT) or the Programme of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All Its Aspects, among others. The authors of the text underline the importance of addressing the structural causes of organized crime, and in particular, the smuggling of weapons, including socio-economic factors and the gender dimension. The resolution also recognizes the space offered by the Working Group on Firearms, a subsidiary of the Conference, as a privileged space for the exchange of experiences between experts on relevant issues, for example, in the fields of marking and tracing.

MIKTA promotes gender equality in the combat against organized crime

The Permanent Representatives of Mexico, Indonesia, the Republic of Turkey Australia Korea, and participated on October 20th in a joint event to highlight the importance of incorporating gender equality in the international community's efforts to address transnational organized crime in all its forms. This event took place in the framework of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime.

In her speech, Ambassador Alicia Buenrostro Massieu pointed out that



this is the first initiative of MIKTA within the international organizations based in Vienna. She noted that MIKTA is a multicultural and intra-regional association of countries that share fundamental values and are committed to active participation in multilateral fora. Therefore, the common interest in promoting gender equality offered a perfect opportunity in this context.

During the event, Mexico promoted its experience in implementing an approach to crime prevention by addressing socio-economic factors, which considers the specific needs of women and girls as well as gender vulnerabilities that can contribute to discourage from getting involved in criminal activities. She highlighted the valuable work of the National Institute of Statistics and Geography of Mexico (INEGI, acronym in Spanish) in the field of gender statistics and the work of the Interministerial Committee Against Trafficking in Persons, in compliance with the obligations of the corresponding UN Protocol.

México participated in the 17th meeting of the Board of Representatives of the Regional Cooperation Agreement for the Promotion of Nuclear Science and Technology in Latin America and the Caribbean



The Seventeenth Meeting of the Board of Representatives the of Regional Cooperation for Agreement the Promotion of Nuclear Science and Technology in Latin America and the Caribbean (ARCAL) was held on September 27, 2016, in Vienna, Austria, as part of the 60th General Conference of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA). This

meeting was attended by representatives of 20 countries of the region, and provided an excellent opportunity for ARCAL members to review the activities that have been carried out by its different bodies this year, adopt the relevant reports and define strategies for next year.

ARCAL is a mechanism for promoting the safe and peaceful use of nuclear energy and technologies among the countries of Latin America and the Caribbean through technical cooperation schemes and using the different capacities of the countries of the region, with the assistance of the IAEA, in areas such as improving agriculture and food, pest control and strengthening public health systems. Mexico currently owns the vice-presidency of ARCAL and will assume the presidency in 2017. ARCAL's functions are subdivided into the Technical Cooperation Authority (OCTA), covered in Mexico by the National Institute for Nuclear Research (ININ, Webpage: www.inin.gob.mx) and the Board of Representatives, whose responsibility corresponds, in the case of Mexico, to the Permanent Mission of Mexico in Vienna.

Consular Section

How to obtain a Criminal Records Certificate?

The Consular Section of the Embassy is not authorized to issue criminal records certificates or certifications. In matters of federal jurisdiction, the Ministry of the Interior, through the National Security Commission, issues those certificates and, in matters of regional jurisdiction, the Offices of the State Prosecutor for each State of the Mexican Republic.

Registry Data Certificates of the PGR

Since February 9th, 2012, the Attorney General's Office (PGR), aided by all State branches across the Mexican Republic, issues Registry Data Certificates, which consist of information on the existence or nonexistence of data derived from preliminary investigations, both federal and regional laws. If the registry information of an applicant does not contain information on a court decision sentencing a penalty or a security measure, which has been executed, it is considered that there is no criminal record.

The PGR only issues the Registry Data Certificates at the request of some authorities of the federal government, including embassies and consulates. Therefore, when a Mexican citizen abroad requires proof of the lack of criminal records, the Consular Section of the Embassy provides the applicant with official correspondence addressed to the PGR, requesting the issuing of a Registry Data Certificate. This correspondence must include documents of the applicant as attachments, such as fingerprints, copy of passport, copy of birth certificate and copy of the proof of residence abroad.

The proceedings before the PGR can be performed by a friend or a relative of the applicant by means of a simple <u>carta poder</u> (proxy letter), signed by the grantor before two witnesses, which authorizes a third party to perform the procedure. The letter must include attached a copy of an official ID of the two witnesses. The person who will perform the procedure shall submit to the PGR his/her own official ID (with photograph).

For the Consular Section to provide the official correspondence addressed to the PGR, it is necessary that the applicant appears at an appointment scheduled with the office of the Consular Section, where his/her fingerprints will be collected, and present his/her valid Mexican passport, birth certificate and the proof of residence abroad. The appointment can be requested by email <u>consulmexaustria@sre.gob.mx</u> within the public opening hours (Monday to Friday from 09:00a.m. to 12:45p.m.). The proceedings at the Consular Section of the Embassy are **free of charge.**

Mexico's results in the Global Competitiveness Report 2016-2017 of the World Economic Forum



The World Economic Forum (WEF) has released the Global Competitiveness Report 2016-2017, which evaluates the performance of 138 economies by means of their productivity and generated prosperity. The Global Competitiveness Report (GCR) is based on the analysis of 114 variables grouped into 12 pillars:

1) Institutions; 2) Infrastructure; 3) Macroeconomic stability; 4) Health and basic education; 5) Higher education and training; 6) Efficiency in the merchandise market; 7) Efficiency in the labour market; 8) Financial market sophistication; 9) Technological preparedness; 10) Market size; 11) Business sophistication; and, 12) Innovation.

Since 2004, the RCG, one of the most important publications of the WEF, evaluates the performance of economies through business opinion surveys and different national and international sources. In the 2016-2017 edition, countries at the head of the overall rating were Switzerland, followed by Singapore, United States, Netherlands and Germany. Mexico moved up six places from rank 57 to rank 51, thus obtaining the best score in the last decade. The points scored by Mexico reflect the opinions expressed by 14,723 private sector CEOs from 141 nations in the Business Opinion Survey, carried out by the WEF between February and June 2016. With 304 answered surveys, Mexico remains the third country with the highest participation in the survey, surpassed only by the United States and China. The improvement in the country's rating was mainly driven by the rise in the market's efficiency. The internal and external competition in the merchandise market increased significantly due to the progress of reforms in the fields of competition and trade policy (moved up 12 places to rank 70).

San Andrés Míxquic and its Day of the Dead

31st, they set the table for the "Altar of the Dead" with a tablecloth, black or white candelabra and candles. On November 1st, the bells toll at 12:00 o'clock, announcing the arrival of the souls of children and adults.

On November 2nd, **the famous "Alumbrada"** (Lighting) takes place at the cemetery, a homage to the dead who left a memory in this world. At 19:00p.m., people start gathering at the graves decorated with flowers and lighting candles. The cemetery brightens up with the candles' light to show the dead their way. In the centre of the cemetery is **the Temple of San Andrés**, whose altar retable and roof are worth a visit. Finally, on November 3rd, the neighbors go from house to house and exchange fruit, bread and food, concluding the festivities of the "Day of the Dead".

San Andrés Míxquic, which means "place of the guard of water" is one of the seven ancient villages of the Tláhuac district in Mexico City. Míxquic is part of the zone declared as one of the UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Every year, during the festivities on the occasion of the "Day of the Dead", Míxquic receives thousands of Mexican and foreign tourists.

On October 31st, the festivities begin in this village with its many customs and colors. There are theatre performances, music, exhibitions, dance, different types of food and showing of offerings. Also on October

The "Altar of the Dead" tradition: origin and meaning in Mexico



Death is an omnipresent figure in Mexican art with a wide representative variety from goddess, protagonist of stories and legends, critical character of society, to smiling guest at our table. In Mexico, indigenous cultures conceived death as a dialectical unity: the life-death binomial, due to which death coexisted in all manifestations of their culture. It is an arduous task to understand death and its meaning, a work covering countless moments of reflection, rituals and ceremonies of different kinds, which has erected the maximum plastic symbol representing this festivity: The Altar of the Dead. This representation is perhaps the most important tradition of Mexican popular culture and one of the best known internationally; it is even considered an Intangible Cultural Heritage protected by UNESCO.

President Peña Nieto meets the Prime Minister of Finland, Juha Sipilä



On October 12th, President Peña Nieto received the Prime Minister of Finland, Juha Sipilä. They congratulated themselves on the occasion of the 80th anniversary of the signing of the Treaty of Friendship, which established diplomatic relations between the two countries. The Mexican President underscored the readiness of his government to continue working with Finland to increase economic strengthen exchange and educational, scientific and training cooperation in the UN Peacekeeping Operations. Prime Minister Sipilä reiterated the invitation for President Peña Nieto to visit Finland and stressed his government's interest in seizing cooperation opportunities arising from the structural

reforms, primarily in the telecommunications sector. Finland is the world's 27th largest investor in Mexico and the 12th in the countries of the European Union. Read full article in English >>>

Therefore, the **National Council to Prevent Discrimination (CONAPRED)** invited the staff of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to join in this commemoration and give visibility to the different actions undertaken to prevent and eliminate discrimination in Mexico in social networks with the **hashtag #PréndeteVsLaDiscriminación**. The Embassy of Mexico in Austria joined this action to express its support for the fight against discrimination.

Mexico forms the largest Human Pink Ribbon in History against breast cancer



The entire month of October, the Mexican Social Security Institute (IMSS, acronym in Spanish) promotes a comprehensive strategy raise to awareness about breast cancer, including prevention activities, promotion and diagnostics. On October 1st, a total of 11,224 people formed the largest Human Pink Ribbon in History at the Campo Marte, headed by the Director General of the IMSS, Mikel Arriola. The call was attended by staff of the Ministry of National Defense, the Ministry of the Navy, ISSSTE, the Ministry of Health and Pemex, as well as thousands of volunteers who joined as spokesmen for the fight.

This action is part of **the institutional strategy "Mi Lucha es Rosa"** to send a message to society about prevention and awareness, because only by joining efforts it will be possible to achieve a reduction of mortality from breast cancer in Mexico. Mikel Arriola stressed that the IMSS had increased the number of mammograms from about one million in 2012 to one million 300,000 so far this year. He also highlighted that mortality from this disease had declined in 18.6% within his institution. He announced that the first quarter of next year, the IMSS will present a new prevention model "Family Medicine Units" to ensure that all women between 40 and 60 years assigned to their unit have a mammogram done.

Furthering actions to strengthen Mexico's viticulture



The Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Rural Development, Fisheries and Food (SAGARPA, acronym in Spanish) will promote increased production, consumption and quality of Mexican wines to strengthen the national viticulture sector, which currently registers a growth rate of 12%. Currently, the area devoted to winegrowing sums up 6,000 hectares, approximately which produces more than 25 million bottles of wine per year. Baja California is one of the largest wine producers in Mexico.

Productive and technological measures will be focused to increase the area and yield of the vineyards and to maintain wine quality. In addition, the Mexican Senate is currently preparing an initiative to reduce the tax burden on this sector, which will generate a larger participation of Mexican wine in the domestic market and create new jobs in the sector.





All cultures develop a vision about death that determines their own life and thought. 
