
The new Ambassador Alicia Buenrostro Massieu presented Credentials



On May 22, 2016, the new Ambassador of Mexico, Alicia Buenrostro Massieu, presented Credentials to the Austrian President Heinz Fischer at the Hofburg Palace in Vienna. She acts as the Ambassador of Mexico in Austria, concurrent to Slovenia and Slovakia.

Ambassador Buenrostro Massieu is a career diplomat since 1990, and was promoted to the rank of Ambassador in 2012. From August 2011 to May 2016, she was the Consul General of Mexico in Hong Kong and Macau.

Mexico is the second most important destination of Austrian exports.

In the first quarter of 2016, Austrian exports to Mexico increased by 55 percent to a total of 242 million euros, exceeding notably exports to Canada and Brazil, according to the Austrian Chamber of Commerce (WKÖ): https://www.wko.at/Content.Node/service/aussenwirtschaft/ mx/Oesterreichs-Export-nach-Mexiko-im-ersten-Quartal-auf-Rek.html

This means Mexico has become the second most important destination for Austrian exports in the Americas, preceded only by the United States. The strongest impulse came from the machine production sector, responding to the boost of the automobile industry in Mexico.

This represents a continuity of last year's trend: In 2015, Mexico was the country with the highest increase for Austrian exports worldwide (+28 percent):

On June 8, 2016, a commercial delegation of the Ministry of Economic Development of Jalisco (SEDECO) attended a seminar in Bratislava, organized by the Slovak Investment and Trade Development Agency (SARIO) in cooperation with the Ministry of European and Foreign Affairs of Slovakia and the Embassy of Mexico.

The Mexican delegation met with the representatives of Slovakian companies, like Pavol Machovic (*PPA Controll*), Lubomir Slauka (*Kinex Bearings*), Alexandra Marquez (*International BEZ Group spol. s.r.o.*), Pavol Harcek (*Kerametal*), Pavel Bohác (*Ses TImace*) and Vladimir Grznar (*Grznár & Co*). At the seminar, the delegation presented the excellent business opportunities in the State of Jalisco.

Within the framework of this event, the Minister of Economic Development of Jalisco, José Palacios Jiménez, also visited Austrian companies in Tyrol and Lower Austria in order to intensify the commercial relationship between Mexico and Austria.

Mexico renews its commitment to the Montreal Protocol





On July 22 and 23, 2016, the Third Extraordinary Meeting of the Parties to the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer took place in Vienna, Austria. Mexico participated at the events with a high-level delegation led by **Mexican Minister of Environment, Rafael Pacchiano Alamán**.

The Montreal Protocol is a multilateral agreement aimed at avoiding and reducing substances that deplete the ozone layer.

Mexico ratified the Montreal Protocol on March 31, 1988, and is strongly committed to its implementation.

Mexico and the IAEA against the Zika virus



Mexico is working with the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) to find a way of sterilizing mosquitoes in order to fight the Zika virus.

Scientists are trying to sterilize male mosquitoes by radioactive radiation and contribute to eliminating plagues like Zika, dengue and yellow fever.

President Peña Nieto signs decree to recognize LGBT rights in Constituion

On May 18, 2016, the Mexican President signed a decree to amend the Mexican Constitution in order to recognize the equal treatment of homosexual partnerships, following the decision of the Supreme Cort.

"Each Mexican, regardless of his social position, religion, ethnic group and sexual orientation, has the right to be happy and fully self-actualize himself", according to Peña Nieto. The President also gave instructions to set up a national campaign against homophoby and include homosexuality as a topic in school curricula.

Furthermore, Mr. Peña Nieto participated as the first President in the history of Mexico on the occasion of the National Day against Homophoby.

On July 18, 2016, President Peña Nieto signed seven legal packages approved by the Congress to implement the constitutional reform initiated in May 2015 with the objective of introducing the new National Anti-Corruption-System.

The National Anti-Corruption-System includes a coordinating committee of independent experts, an anti-corruption prosecutor's office, and special departments in public institutions, such as the Administrative Court and the Audit Court. The introduction of the Anti-Corruption-System reflects Mexico's effort to guarantee more transparency and accountability.
