TEMPORARY RESIDENT (MORE THAN 180 DAYS AND LESS THAN 4 YEARS)

Requirements:

- 1. **Visa Application.** Must be written in <u>English</u> or <u>Spanish</u> and signed the same as the signature in the passport. <u>Download here in English or Spanish</u>
- 2. Valid passport original and one photocopy of the main page 6 months validity rule
- 3. One passport size color picture

- 4. Original and one photcopy of the Alien Registration Card (ARC) Or the document that proves the applicant is a foreign legal resident of South Korea. This only applies for non Korean citizens
- 5. Visa fee around 70,000KRW (depending on the USD/KRW exchange rate)
 We only accept cash KOREAN WON to be paid after the visa interview. We do not accept credit/debit cards. Non-refundable if not approved.

6. Proof of economic solvency:

- a) Original and copy of documents showing that the applicant has a job or pension that yields a **monthly income of \$3,610,078 KWR after taxes during the previous 7 months**. (bring the last 7 months of your paystubs and the bank statements that shows the direct deposit of your salary).
- b) Original and copy of proof of personal bank accounts with monthly savings balance of at least \$60,167,972 KRW during the previous 13 months (bring the last 13 months of bank statements).

After entering Mexico with this kind of visa you have 30 days to go to the nearsest "INSTITUTO NACIONAL DE MIGRACIÓN" (INAMI) office to get your resident ID.

Important notes:

- To apply for a visa first you will need an appointment at the booking page: https://citas.sre.gob.mx/

- 2. The issuance of visa might take up to 10 working days after the interview day, If necessary, you might be asked to support your application with supplementary documentation.
- 3. In the case of a spouse, parent or child who is economically dependent upon the foreigner holding the Mexican visa, the person may simply prove the family relationship with official documents (original) and prove economic solvency per each relative.
- 4. If you present a document issued from a country different than Mexico or South Korea, it must come with an apostille or legalization as applicable, and with an official translation to Spanish, this applies also for the bank statement.

^{*}All bank statements must be original.

^{*}If you use paperless banking, you must have your statements stamped by your bank. We do not accept simple prints from downloaded bank statements.

^{*}The Documents must be in English or Spanish.

^{*}This status of residence is limited to the condition that you cannot receive a salary in Mexico. Please note that if you go to Mexico as a dispatched or expatriate emplyoee from a Korea corporation or institution, you should receive your salary in Korea.
