



Requirements:

1. **Visa Application.** Must be written in [English](#) or [Spanish](#) and signed the same as the signature in the passport. [Download here in English or Spanish](#)
2. **Valid passport original and one photocopy of the main page**
6 months validity rule
3. **One passport size color picture**
Front view, no eyeglasses and white background.
4. **Original and one photocopy of the Alien Registration Card (ARC)**
Or the document that proves the applicant is a foreign legal resident of South Korea.
This only applies for non Korean citizens
5. **Visa fee around 70,000KRW (depending on the USD/KRW exchange rate)**
We only accept cash KOREAN WON to be paid after the visa interview. We do not accept credit/debit cards. Non-refundable if not approved.
6. **Proof of economic solvency to cover tuition, housing and board while in Mexico:**

- a) Original and copy of documents showing that the applicant has a job, pension or scholarship that yields a **monthly income of \$1,203,359 KWR after taxes during the previous 4 months**. (bring the last 4 months of your paystubs and the bank statements that shows the direct deposit of your salary). [입금내역서](#)
- b) Original and copy of proof of personal bank accounts with **monthly savings balance of at least \$12,033,594 KRW during the previous 4 months** (bring the last 4months of bank statements). [잔액증명서](#)

Economic solvency can be satisfied by the student, his or her parents or whoever has the legal custody over the student, as long as he or she is not older than 25 years of age in this case you must present: Family Relations Certificate Original in Korean with English or Spanish Translation; bank statement of your parents bank account; Copy of your parents' passports (signatures must be signed. If there is no passport, a copy of the resident registration card must be handwritten) and "Affidavit of Support" written in english or spanish (document written by computer and the financial guarantee must specify the student's place of stay, purpose of stay, period stay etc.)

*All bank statements must be original.

*If you use paperless banking, you must have your statements stamped by your bank. We do not accept simple prints from downloaded bank statements.

*The Documents must be in English or Spanish.

7. Original ink signed acceptance letter from the school or university where you will study.

We do not accept printed PDF documents. The institution must be accredited by the national education system in Mexico. Such letter should include:

- i) Your complete name
- ii) Fully described program to be studied, including level
- iii) Name of the course and dates
- iv) The course when it starts and ends
- v) Tuition cost
- vi) Full name and contact information of the school or university.

If the applicant is a minor both parents should be present to sign the application. If only one parent is present, it is mandatory to submit a notarized authorization (Spanish or English) from the other parent. If minors or persons requiring legal guardianship attend by themselves or someone different to their parents, it is mandatory to submit a notarized document in which their parents or legal guardianship authorize the visa application



**After entering Mexico with this kind of visa you have 30 days to go to the nearest
“INSTITUTO NACIONAL DE MIGRACIÓN” (INAMI) office to get your resident ID.**

Important notes:

1. To apply for a visa first you will need an appointment at the booking page:

2. The issuance of visa might take up to 10 working days after the interview day, If necessary, you might be asked to support your application with supplementary documentation.
3. In the case of a spouse, parent or child who is economically dependent upon the foreigner holding the Mexican visa, the person may simply prove the family relationship with official documents (original) and prove economic solvency per each relative.
4. If you present a document issued from a country different than Mexico or South Korea, it must come with an apostille or legalization as applicable, and with an official translation to Spanish, this applies also for the bank statement.
