

## United States - Mexico - Canada Agreement (USMCA)

## Environment

The objective of this chapter is to promote environmental protection in a trade openness context, through commitments that strengthen the parties' ability to enforce their environmental legislation and their obligations in multilateral environmental agreements. USMCA will be the third international trade agreement where Mexico incorporates a specific chapter regarding the environment.

## General provisions:

- To promote air quality, sustainable use of biodiversity, combat wildlife trafficking, and maintain institutional frameworks, public participation and regional cooperation that the region's authorities have developed within the North America Commission for Environmental Cooperation.
- Marine species protection, such as whales and sea turtles, including maritime habitats.
- Enhance the effectiveness of shipment inspections containing wild fauna and flora.
- Parties acknowledge the importance of trade and investment in environmental goods and services, including clean tech, while agreeing to undertake efforts for its facilitation and promotion.
- In case of **non-compliance** of the chapter's provisions, the parties could participate in **high** level or ministerial consultations or could be subject to the **Dispute Settlement Mechanism**.
- The chapter includes the communication mechanism of the North American Environment Cooperation Agreement (ECA), thus strengthening transparency when receiving questions or comments from society regarding the chapter's implementation.
- It includes specific provisions not considered on the ECA, regarding multilateral environment agreements, such as:
  - Ozone layer protection;
  - o Protection of the Marine Environment from Ship Pollution;
  - o Fight against marine litter;
  - o Biodiversity conservation and sustainable use;
  - o Sustainable fisheries management; among others.

The inclusion of such provisions demonstrates the parties' interest to **address the environmental agenda's challenges,** as well as its commitment to comply with their multilateral obligations.
