


Experience the wonders of TABASCO

"These are the most important ruins of the Chontals culture between AD 700 to 900 in Comalcalco (not the Mayas). Because there were no stones for the construction in the region, the Chontals brought Soil, sand and oyster shells from the delta distributary of the river Seco to produce bricks, bounded with an elaborated mortar. This kind of materials has protected the buildings up to date.
