Permanent Resident Visa - Economic solvency or Pension

Embassy of Mexico to the Czech Republic

Applicable to foreigners who intend to enter Mexico as permanent resident status.

Applications are received with prior appointment Monday to Friday from 09:00 to 12:00, at the Consular Section of the Mexican Embassy, located at the V Jirchářích 151/10, Prague Tel. +(420) 283 061 530. To request an appointment, Email: embamexche.consulado@sre.gob.mx

All applicants must appear in person for an interview, including minors, who must be accompanied by mother and father or legal quardians.

Kindly notice: the period for processing a visa application is of a maximum of 10 working days.

Requirements:

- I. Fill out an application form. Applications can be obtained at the Consular Section.
- II. Valid Passport + 1 photocopy (the page where picture is).
- III. One passport size front color picture, without glasses, white background.
- IV. Proof of your legal status in the Czech Republic + 1 photocopy
- V. To fulfill the following minimum financial records:

Pensioner

- Bank account with an average monthly balance of at least 20,000 days of minimum salary in Mexico City, during the last 12 months, (original bank letter and monthly statements)
 OR
- b. Documents that proof pension with an income of more than 500 days of minimum salary in Mexico City, during the last 6 months. (Original company letter and monthly payment slips
- V. Visa fee \$44 USD. No other currency is accepted. Please notice that there is no reimbursement for visa payment, even if the visa is denied. The payment is for the review of your application, so please check carefully that you have the completed documents before submitting your application.

Documents not issued by Mexican or Czech authorities must be legalized or apostilled.

Presentation of these documents does not guarantee visa issuance.

Kindly notice that all applications are subject to approval.

A visa does not guarantee entry into Mexico, where the final decision will be taken by an immigration officer at the point of entry.

The holder of a Permanent Resident Visa must visit the nearest immigration office within the next 30 days after entering Mexican territory, to process their Residency card which authorizes their legal stay in national territory.
