Embassy of Mexico to Czech Republic

Applicable to foreigners who intend to enter Mexico on temporary resident status in order to stay for more than 180 days and not more than four years, except those who have a job offer.

Applications are received with prior appointment. To request an appointment, Email: embamexche.consulado@sre.gob.mx

All applicants must appear in person for an interview, including minors, who must be accompanied by mother and father or legal guardians.

Kindly notice: the period for processing a visa application is of a maximum of 10 working days.

Requirements:

- I. Fill out an application form. Applications can be obtained at the Consular Section.
- II. Valid Passport + 1 photocopy (the page where picture is).
- III. One passport size front color picture, without glasses, white background.
- IV. Proof of your legal status in Czech Republic. Immigration entry stamp, current visa or Czech residence card.
- V. To fulfill the following minimum financial records:
 - Bank letter account with an average monthly balance that_exceeds 5,000 days of minimum salary in Mexico City, during the last 12 months, (original letter and monthly statements)
 OR
 - b. Employment or pension with an income that exceeds 300 days of minimum salary in Mexico City during the last 6 months (Company letter and payment slips).

VI. Payment of the visa fee is \$51 US dollars. No other currency is accepted Please notice that there is no reimbursement for visa payment, even if the visa is denied. The payment is for the review of your application, so please check carefully that you have the completed documents before submitting your application.

Documents not issued by Mexican or Czech authorities must be legalized or apostilled and translated into Spanish or English.

Presentation of these documents does not guarantee visa issuance. Please kindly notice that all applications are subject to approval.

A visa does not guarantee entry into Mexico, where the final decision will be taken by an immigration officer at the point of entry.

The holder of a Temporary Resident Visa must visit the nearest immigration office within the next 30 days after entering Mexican territory, to process their Residency card which authorizes their legal stay in national territory.
