Foreigners who wish to travel to Mexico to conduct remunerated activities must invariably have an offer of employment. The Mexican institution/person who intends to employ the foreigner must submit the visa application directly to the National Migration Institute in Mexico (INM). The Embassy can only issue a visa if it has been authorized by the INM.

In compliance with all requirements a valid single-entry visa will be issued. Once the applicant has entered Mexican territory, he or she must, within the first 30 calendar days, apply to the National Migration Institute (INM) for a temporary resident card.
