AQUACULTURE

- In 2017, aquaculture production from #Mexico's coastal and inland waters and ponds amounted to 404,000 tons of fish and shellfish, with a value of 17.813 billion pesos. <a href="https://bithub.com/b

NAGOYA PROTOCOL

- #Mexico advises indigenous and local communities on how each can develop a Biocultural Community Protocol #BCP, in which they devise strategies for the protection, management and sustainable use of their genetic resources and related traditional knowledge, in addition to planning for the sharing of any benefits arising from their utilization. #NagoyaProtocol
- f Implementation of the #NagoyaProcol contributes to complying with various international commitments, including the Strategic Plan for #UNBiodiversity 2011-2020 and the #2030Agenda #SDGs.
- #Mexico is working with five indigenous and three local communities to strengthen national implementation of the #NagoyaProtocol. Each community receives assistance and advice on developing its Biocultural Community Protocol #BCP.
- #GoodNews #Mexico has trained 676 people in order to work towards national implementation of the #NagoyaProtocol, including 400 government officials and 120 researchers and scientists.

AIR TRAVEL

- The growth of #AirTravel over the last five years helped boost tourism-related revenue received by #Mexico by 67.5%, from USD 12.739 billion in 2012 to USD 21.336 billion in 2017. #LearnMore Click here bit.ly/2qLtp3l
- During this administration, eight bilateral agreements on air travel were ratified, and nine more are in the process of ratification, including agreements with Canada, the United States, Italy, Brazil and the United Arab Emirates. bit.ly/2Lt0evn
