STATE BY STATE: YUCATAN

Yucatan is renowned in Mexico and the world through stories of ancient travelers who discovered an extraordinary civilization, with remarkable knowledge, amazing archeological sites and exuberant nature: the Mayans. Currently, many countries study the great Mayan civilization, but few people know that many of their cities, customs and traditions can be still admired and enjoyed today. Nowadays, Yucatan has a variety of tourist and travel services that are ready to receive all types of travelers who want to see unique and authentic places and enormous cultural wealth. Yucatan is the place to discover true wonders in a quiet and friendly atmosphere.

Yucatan's history dates back to around 1000 BC, when the Mayan civilization was born, evolved and finally disappeared, swallowed by the jungle. Some Mayan cities have been restored, such as Uxmal, Chichen Itza, Mayapan, Ek Balam and others of the Puuc Route. Upon the arrival of the Spaniards in the 16th century, they found that the Mayan indigenous people were disorganized, so it was not overly difficult to subject them; the Spaniards then founded colonial cities, among of which are Merida, Valladolid and Izamal.

Between the 16th and 19th centuries Yucatan was involved in various armed conflicts, such as pirate attacks off coast and indigenous uprisings against the Spaniards. averaged between 1.0 and 2.0 percent per year, so "the goal to come to Sweden is to affect this trend and achieve a substantial increase" by promoting tourist attractions of the Pacific like Puerto Vallarta. Luis Villaseñor, Director of Tourism and Public Relations of the Puerto Vallarta Trust, noted that Puerto Vallarta receives four million foreign visitors per year and that tourism to this area increased significantly after the production of the film "La noche de la iguana," released in 1964, starring Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor.

At this very successful meeting, representatives from the most important agencies and tour operators of Sweden were in attendance, such as TUI and Ving, which are currently the only operators established in Stockholm that offer charter flights to Mexico. Also present were members of important media publications, such as the magazines RES and Vagabond, the two main publications specialising in tourism in Sweden. In addition, representatives of other travel agencies with interest in Mexico and their new destinations, as well as important independent journalists and bloggers, also participated.

NEW FLIGHT FROM HELSINKI TO PUERTO VALLARTA ANNOUNCED

This winter, the Finnish airline Finnair announced the launch of a series of new flights from Helsinki in 2017: Havana, Goa, Puerto Plata, and Puerto Vallarta, the latter in Mexico.

The new route to Puerto Vallarta was opened after two years of negotiations and is the first regular flight to Mexico from a Nordic country which flies to a destination other than Mexico City or Cancún.

The flight will be operated with Airbus 350 equipment with a 251-seat capacity in Coach and 46 seats in Business Class, which comes to a total of around 5,000 flights this winter season.

GO GLOBAL SEMINAR IN JONKÖPING


