PRIME MINISTER FREDRIK REINFELDT VISITS MEXICO

- Prime Minister of Sweden, Mr. Fredrik Reinfeldt, will arrive in Mexico City tonight. Tomorrow he will meet the President of Mexico, Mr. Enrique Peña Nieto.
- During his visit, the Prime Minister will be accompanied by the Swedish Minister for Trade, Ms. Ewa Björling, and a large business delegation representing most of the main Swedish companies, specialized in different fields within the industry.

Tomorrow, Prime Minister Reinfeldt will start his official activities in Mexico. In the morning, Prime Minister Reinfeldt, accompanied by Minister Björling, will hold a meeting with Representatives of the Mexican business sector. Later on, he will be invited to give a magisterial conference at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, entitled "Globalization and European Competitiveness". At noon, he will be welcomed by President of Mexico, Mr. Enrique Peña Nieto, and his Government cabinet at National Palace. High level officials and businessmen from both countries will attend the luncheon offered by Mexican President in honor of Mr. Reinfeldt and his delegation. Governments of Mexico and Sweden will sign a Joint Declaration as well as different agreements on cooperation in health and export credits.

Minister Björling will start her official activities today in Mexico City. She will participate in a seminar on transport and in a forum on health, which have the objective of endorsing the successful bilateral trade relations, increasing business opportunities for Swedish companies in Mexico, and developing business contacts between Swedish and Mexican companies. Her agenda also includes a meeting with the Mexican Minister of Economy, Mr. Ildefonso Guajardo Villareal, and meetings with high level officials of other Secretariats.

Prime Minister Reinfeldt's visit to Mexico will bring our countries closer and will unleash new business opportunities. This visit is an opportunity to stimulate societies in both Mexico and Sweden to better understand each other.
