

MEXICAN VISA

VISA APPLICATION IS WITH APPOINTMENT ONLY (ONE APPOINTMENT FOR EACH VISA APPLICANT)

EXEMPTION OF THE MEXICAN VISA

Holders of any of the following <u>valid documents</u> are exempted from the requirement of the Mexican visa to travel to Mexico for a period of entry not exceeding 180 days and for non-remunerated activities.

VISA APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- Visa applications will only be accepted with a scheduled appointment.
- The Embassy will set an appointment on the earliest available date.
 THERE ARE NO URGENT APPOINTMENTS.
- The visa application is processed only at the Embassy of Mexico in Viet Nam, located in HANOI.
- Present complete required documents (original and copies) on appointment date. The Embassy reserves the right not to process incomplete applications.
- Applicants are responsible to present all required documents as indicated on the Visa Section of the Embassy's website.
- There will be no prior review of documents before the submission of visa application.
- Submission of applications and collection of visas are strictly **personal**.
- The application processing fee must be paid in cash, <u>IN DOLLARS ONLY</u> when submitting the application at the Consular Section of the Embassy (banknotes in good condition issued after 2013). Payment is <u>NOT REFUNDABLE</u> regardless of the visa application result.
- The visa will be subject to approval after the consular interview. The Embassy has up to 10 (TEN) working days to issue the visa application result.



- The Consular Section does not issue express visas. Visas, if granted, are issued in 5 to 10 working days.
- Admission of entry to Mexico will be determined exclusively by the Immigration Authority at the point of entry.

VISA APPLICATION FOR MINORS

- Visa applications of minors must be signed by both parents in the presence of the consular officer. It is necessary to present identifications and legal documents proving their relationship with the minors.
- If one of the parents cannot attend the appointment with the minor, it is mandatory to submit identification, documents proving his/ her relation with the applicant and a notarized authorization from the other parent, to allow the minor to apply for the visa, and, if approved, to travel to Mexico.
- If the minor is under legal guardianship, it is mandatory to submit the necessary notarized documents.

IMMIGRATION INFORMATION

According to Mexico's Migration Law, the visa does not guarantee the entry into Mexico: the final admission is subject to the approval by the migratory and sanitary authorities at the point of entry.

At the point of entry, you may be required to present the following documentation:

- A valid passport
- Valid Mexican visa or valid visa from USA, United Kingdom, Canada, Japan or any Schengen country or proof of permanent residence in USA, United Kingdom, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Peru, Japan or any Schengen country.
- Hotel bookings or return or onward flight ticket.
- Documentation related to the purpose of your trip (tour itinerary, company invitation, etc.)
- Documents proving financial means.
